<u>@SDMesaPrez</u> Q1. What is your definition of equity? How is equity-minded practice embedded in your work. @DrPollard MC #EquityChat @lamkeithcurry @SDMesaPrez

<u>@DrPollard_MC</u> Equity, at it's most basic level, is about ensuring fairness in treatment, access, and outcomes. For me, though, it's about working to remove barriers that impede; it's about lifting voices and experiences that have been marginalized. #EquityChat

@poppyfitch Lifting voices and clearing barriers, [hundred points]!

<u>@SDMesaPrez</u> Tell us about some areas where you feel we've seen equity gains in the last 5 years @DrPollard MC @lamkeithcurry #EquityChat

<u>@DrPollard MC</u> I struggle with this, because I do think we have made some gains—if we look at access to higher education by some groups, but higher education we have not made enough SYSTEMIC changes to solicit the transformative energy of which we are capable.

<u>@poppyfitch</u> Mulling on how and why we've not been able to see systemic changes... will mustering more creativity and collaboration than we have seen in the past do it? What do you view is the thing?

<u>@ahandsintheair</u> I love the idea of "lifting voices and experiences" as that creates space to see, hear, connect with and validate our students. When we see them, we can truly serve and support them. #EquityChat

<u>@DrPollard MC</u> But more: had @montgomerycoll faculty interviewee say this to me and it has stuck: equity and inclusion (because you need both) is about providing her students with the explicit permission to be themselves in her classroom—and all that means. #equitytalks

<u>@ahandsintheair</u> "...providing students with the explicit permission to be themselves.....—and all that means." -- THAT IS GOLDEN! #EquityChat

<u>@MisterElAre</u> A1: In my analysis and work, I look at equity as a goal we are working towards—a goal that will be met when we fully understand and recognize the ways that systems have marginalized many for the privilege of others. Equity seeks to undo this. #equitychat

<u>@ahandsintheair</u> [raising hands] We canNOT do this work without situating it in the historical systems and structures that got us here. #EquityChat

<u>@bekyherring #equitychat</u> A1. Equity is putting systems in place to make sure all of our students, regardless of race, socioeconomic status, sexuality, gender, or religion, has equal chance for success. BUT I prefer the language of liberation/justice over equity. Our systems need dismantling!

<u>@DrPollard_MC</u> LOVE THIS!!! Equity demands that dismantling because we have constructed whole systems that have been INTENTIONALLY designed to produce inequitable results.



<u>@bekyherring</u> I often have to reflect on my position as an educator within the context of liberation and justice because if I am not actively working to dismantle this unjust system within the context of my school, I serve as another cog in the wheel of injustices happening to my students.

<u>@lamkeithcurry</u> We cannot serve as another "cog in the wheel of injustices". #EquityChat @DrPollard_MC @SDMesaPrez @lamkeithcurry

<u>@DrPollard MC</u> Equity means that we resist temptations to focus on mere presence but about experience and access to power.

<u>@lamkeithcurry</u> Q2. @DrPollard_MC. And we recognized that we have too many manual/paper processes, and we need to accelerate automation for students and employees.

<u>@ahandsintheair</u> Establishing online/automated processes has been EVERYTHING. We'll definitely hold onto and expand those offerings. We have also seen more diversity with some of our Zoom activities and workshops. Not restricting people by time and place has allowed some to engage differently.

<u>@DrPollard_MC</u> So, @montgomerycoll has deep competency in the delivery of remote learning primarily through online courses—but we hadn't built the bench per say. There were several excellent faculty doing the work, but now we had to mobilize ALL of our faculty quickly—and forforeseeable future.

<u>@lamkeithcurry</u> @DrPollard_MC today I was in a panel for the @chronicle and we were talking about post CoVID. Your thoughts are right on target where we are headed.

<u>@lamkeithcurry</u> @DanielleBMcLean any thoughts. Welcome to #EquityChat, the weekly twitter chat hosted by @lamkeithcurry @SDMesaPrez

<u>@DrPollard_MC</u> Replying to @lamkeithcurry @montgomerycoll and @SDMesaPrez I'm really proud of our CV19 work @montgomerycoll. First, we've privilege student and employee health and safety. We identified a set of guiding principles and assumptions to guide the work—and we admitted both our strengths and weaknesses.

<u>@DrPollard MC</u> Second, we recognized that vulnerable students needed more NOW—and we redirected nearly \$650K to student emergency aid. Next, we developed a plan and executed it: www.montgomerycollege/ResilientMC <u>@DrPollard MC</u> Finally, we're preparing for the future and realizing that higher ed will be fundamentally and forever changed as a resolution of CV19–and we can either wait and be victims or chose to be the defines of our future. I reject the premise that we have no power.

<u>@DrPollard MC</u> Our students and community have empowered us to quickly and responsively adapt—they don't have the luxury of waiting for us to get it together.

<u>@DrPollard MC</u> I also think we have to be courageous enough to look at our structures & ensure they are designed for the students we have now and want to have—not systems designed for employees & the students we wish we had. So, what about evening programming and support for students? Weekends?

<u>@SDMesaPrez</u> And I imagine expectations for flexibility in services will be higher as a result of Remote access now...@DrPollard_MC @lamkeithcurry #EquityChat

<u>@DrPollard_MC</u> Wow. I posed this question last week, and boy did I get some responses! For me, dismantling racism means addressing the following: funding of community colleges (equitably!!!)—why constantly treated as if our work is less valuable and therefore cheaper?

<u>@DrPollard MC</u> Next, had my CAO say that the first equity decision a college makes is in our assessment/testing practices and philosophy. If we know what placement testing does and does not do, why do we continue to embrace it as a litmus test for ability and success?

<u>@DrPollard MC</u> I also believe we have to take on hiring. Yup. Why are ignoring the toxic practices used by some in higher ed that works to perpetuate the culture and profile of a department or program? Are we prepared to address the cultures in which we place newly hired employees?

<u>@DrPollard MC</u> Also, what about Board policies? Dismantling racism must be and is a full-college endeavor: policy, procedure, practice, and promise.

<u>@butiwilltry</u> I'm so bummed I had to miss the Equity chat! Hopefully it's ok to chime in anyway because I love this question. 1) Refunding K-12, 2) equal distribution of public ed funding instead of it being contingent upon property taxes, and 3) FREE! [clapping hands] [clapping hands]

<u>@PatriciaNUSP</u> CSUs have lower division writing courses that are housed in Africana Studies, Native American Studies. Are the only articulated transferable writing courses from community colleges coming out of English departments and not Black/Women's/Chicano/a Studies?

<u>@DrPollard MC</u> So there's this @SDMesaPrez and @lamkeithcurry: higher education was a movement before it was a series of building and people to be managed. In large parts, this nation has constantly looked to higher education to be a national unifier and also a disruptor.



We gotta make sure we do no harm and look for ways to strategies to be radical in how we respond—radical in the latin where we get to the root of things. <u>@DrPollard_MC</u> And we have to embrace our role of matching those who need opportunities with opportunities that exist. Be the translators that community colleges were designed to be over 100 years ago.



@DrPollard MC These ancestors engage, heal my spirit, and inspire!








