<u>@DavidBaime</u> For me, an equitable society is one in which you would be comfortable in whatever place you had in it. Maybe that's utopia but it's my vision. AACC pursues this by advocating for policies that break down all barriers to developing a student's full potential. (1/2) #EquityChat

<u>@DavidBaime</u> Some top issues include: increasing the Pell Grant maximum, enhancing support for Minority-Serving Institutions, and getting Pell Grant funding for short-term programs. And we remain strongly committed to free community college--everywhere! #EquityChat

<u>@DavidBaime</u> Congress is actively considering making Pell Grants non-taxable. This would greatly benefit our financially neediest students. It makes no sense to tax GRANT funds awarded on the basis of need. And this taxation disproportionately affects our students. Speak up! #EquityChat
