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"Advice: (1) continue to <u>#read</u>, study, discuss & act on learning/findings; (2) stay current; (3) engage senior staff in <u>#DEIBdiscussions</u>..." (2/5)

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"(4) engage w/ those leading initiatives on campus; (4) note policies & laws being considered in communities (5) learn of & support campus DEIB initiatives; (3/5)

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(6) assess org & self, regularly; (7) foster a learning culture; (8) collect and analyze data to make data-informed decisions & share that data & evidence, regularly (4/5)

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"This work takes intention, time and trust. Be intentional about your goals, anticipate that true and meaningful connections that lead to sustainable change take time..." (2/3)

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"Embrace ambiguity. If you're really in it for the right reasons, you should constantly be asking yourself tough moral questions. Am I compromising too much or not enough?" (2/4)

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"Am I going too big, too fast, or the exact opposite? Am I upsetting partners by pushing too hard? Leadership is trying to balance competing considerations." (3/4)

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On the one hand, you should always carry a measure of epistemic humility, interrogate your own motives, and introspect. 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"My advice would be to focus on three steps: 1) Developing a command of relevant data that analyzes the scope and scale of equity issues, with a focus on positive benefits" (2/5)

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2) "Developing and implementing a communication strategy to highlight these benefits for the review of legislators, professionals, and the general public (much like UCLA has done with its Civil Rights Project)"(3/5) <u>Equity Avengers @equityavengers 14h</u>

"...and 3) Developing a comprehensive process of advocacy, especially in cases where legislation may be required." (4/4)

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"1. Maintain your mental health: Equity work is a marathon and not a sprint so we must take care of ourselves. 2. Stay the course and stay connected: create a network of colleagues engaged in equity work as your support system." (2/5)

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"3. Engage in professional learning: the field is constantly changing and it is essential that we are learning as much as possible." (3/5)

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"4. Advocate & Amplify: Equity work is under attack. We must use our voices to elevate the moral and ethical core of this work." (4/5)
