(1/3) Institution-sanctioned violence is a concept I first wrote about w/@nadreanjoku. We consider how postsecondary environments not only function in the interest of the state, but also how they act as co-conspirators & accomplices of the state.

(1/4)The most important part of navigating these spaces is recognizing they don't define me. When I feel pulled toward the whims of the academy I conscientiously work to resist it. I love opportunities to write, research, teach, and engage in service.

(2/4)I'm also well aware that postsecondary institutions serve as just one space to do this work. They are not the only spaces. Another reality is most spaces beyond higher education, such as the corporate sector, also have historical lineages of violence toward Black women.

(3/4)What sustains me are my spiritual connections, my relationships with Black women scholars, my consistent efforts to center my family and communal relationships and ensuring I engage in rest strategies.

(4/4)I recently read "Rest is Resistance" by <u>@TheNapMinistry</u>. I love the reminder that rest is a "divine right." We don't need permission to rest. I can move forward & navigate toward equity AND prioritize rest. It's my right to do so and it's detached from my academic work.

(1/5)The <u>#SOSCollective</u> (Saving Our Selves, Saving Our Sistas) has always existed, but we created a name to capture the work we've all done for decades to uplift, celebrate, and advocate for Black women through our scholarship, mentoring, and resource sharing in the academy.

(2/5)Realizing that not every Black woman is part of a collective or circle, we moved the needle forward by expanding our engagement to a broader audience. Its important for us to create a space where the issues Black women face are central.

(3/5)We planned to do more public-facing work, but the resignation of Claudine Gay as Harvard's President, & the loss of Dr. Antoinette Bailey prompted us to move more quickly. The bottom line is Black women don't benefit from protection or care. We have to do this work ourselves

(4/5)The <u>#SOSCollective</u> is one way of responding to that call. We want Black women inside the academy and beyond to live and experience their full humanity. This is our contribution to what we hope will become a broader movement of Black women galvanizing.

(1/4)I love <u>#intersectionality</u>. It's important because equity conversations too often focus solely on race. Intersectionality pushes us to broaden our scope and account for the impact of race, gender, class & other markers of identity within broader systems of oppression.

(3/4) 1) current change models often reproduce "the master's tools", 2) current change models promote silencing and erasure of Black women, yet rely on their labor, and 3) Black women should be positioned as possibility models in the discourses regarding transformation.
