Dr. Gilkerson recognized by The Golden State Warriors and PG&E





Through the LA County Nursing 2035 Initiative, the college is partnering with the Los Angeles Regional Consortium (LARC) to make nursing education more accessible and to make sure students have clear, real paths to long-term careers in the field.


The big picture? This initiative will help more students enter the profession and help the region avoid a major care crisis down the line.
